The #100 car stayed out a few laps later, before Andreas Ziegler handed the car over to Friedrich von Buhlen.



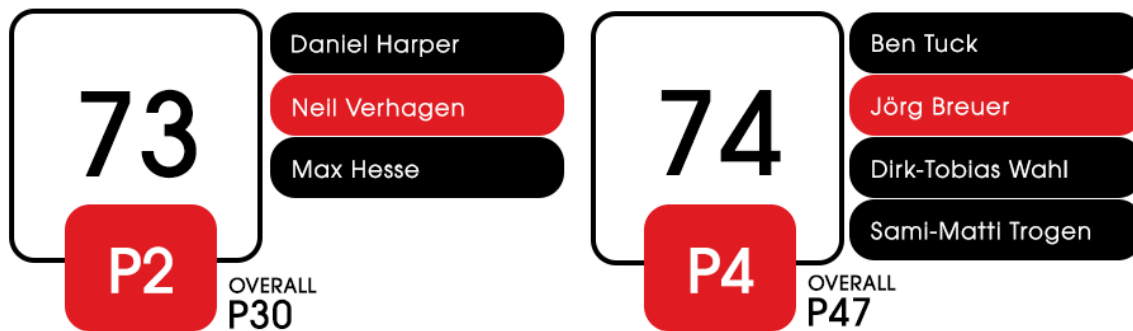
Christian Krognes (NOR), #101 BMW M6 GT3, said:
