SP9 CLASS



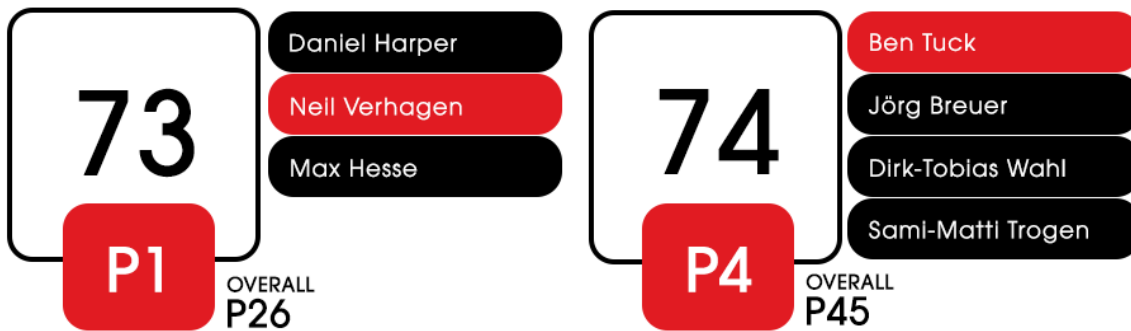
Christian Krognès has now taken the lead of the Nürburgring 24 Hours after a great first stint in the #101 BMW M6 GT3. Krognès made up three more positions over the hour, and then stayed out an extra lap as the eight cars ahead pitted, which means he currently leads the race. Krognès will however fall back in the order to around ninth when he serves his pit stop which is due on the next lap, with Mikkel Jensen set to take over the car.

The #100 car, although it ran into trouble at Brünchen at the restart, was this time able to continue without issue and is still running, down in 28th in the SP9 class.
